As to Question 6......That's a tough question to land definitively on because the overall financial impact to our City,(Red Deer) would have to be fully analysed. I have not encountered this issue in my tenure to date. Service fees and fares represent fair value for the service provided and need to be defensible and transparent to our public. We take pride in being able to do that and in ensuring the cost accounting justifies the fee or fare. As it relates specifically to Transit we already have a fee assistance program for those that need the assistance and our Transit is subsidized about 60% as is. I believe in Transit as a vital community service as the user groups are often lower income folks, the single parent, the senior, the student and the newcomer. I would want to see the full economic impact to all groups and especially our fleet and drivers before making any decision on this. I don't wish to "waffle" on this but this is not something I have had to face in my eight years on Council.
